Reading 1 SIR 17:20-24

To the penitent God provides a way back, he encourages those who are losing hope and has chosen for them the lot of truth. Return to him and give up sin, pray to the LORD and make your offenses few. Gospel MK 10:17-27

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: *You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother.*" He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement, his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the Kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the Kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For men it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God."

Reflection:

The rich young man: the teaching concerning the entrance into the kingdom. The entrance into the kingdom into the kingdom is defined as a gift of God offered to the helpless and the humble. Today's gospel precedes the third prediction of the passion, which bluntly defines the cross as the unique means of salvation. Within this context comes the story of the rich man who wants to possess eternal life, or the kingdom. Here Jesus gives his startling proclamation of the radical demands of the kingdom and the utter impossibility of attaining it through human endeavor. All the candidates for discipleship must give up anything which hinders them from taking Jesus seriously. It is a challenge which is beyond the ordinary capacities of humans. It is only by God's grace that a person can do this.
