Gospel MK 1:40-45

A leper came to him and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched the leper, and said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean." The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean. Then, warning him sternly, he dismissed him at once. Then he said to him, "See that you tell no one anything, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them." The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.

Reflection:

There was man who underwent surgery in a catholic hospital. He was asked by Rev. Sister whether he had insurance to cover the expenses. He replied "No" do you have cash to pay? The sister asked and the reply was negative. Sister asked whether he had any relative who could pay. He replied that he had a spinster sister who was a catholic nun. The sister was perturbed by the word spinster and said, do not you know that nuns are not spinsters, but spouses of Jesus? On hearing this, the patient said, if that is the case, please pass on the bills to my brother-in-law" our concern is not whether Jesus is a brother or brother -in -law, but that Jesus heals. Physical ailments have their beginning in the hardness of the heart. The Israelites turned blind and deaf toward the providence of God who provided for them for forty years. That why pestilence killed them. It is sin that causes sickness. A bodily disease may after all be but a symptom of some ailment in the spiritual part. Jesus waits for the plea. If you wish, make me clean. We shall invite Jesus joyfully to touch and heal us.
